## St Augustine's Primary School Uniform Policy Dress Code

At St Augustine's School - Mossman our uniform is a sign of our community. It reflects the school vision statement and Mission. All families sign as part of the confirmation of enrolment a consent form supporting the uniform and grooming requirements of our school.

Students wear a uniform –

- ◆ to develop a sense of student unity, pride and loyalty to our school.
- ◆ to de-emphasise differences due to superficial appearances.
- ◆ to focus on the real purpose of schooling and develop an individuality based upon intellect, imagination and personality.

It is the responsibility of all parents to ensure that students are attired in correct, well fitting, complete school uniform. Uniforms must be in good condition and repair. Current uniform is to be worn therefore during school hours, and to and from school. Staff members conduct a regular check of uniform standards.

A uniform note may be sent home should there be any digression from the school's dress code.

### Grooming

- Hair must be clean, of a natural colour, brushed and kept off the face – this includes long fringes being out of eyes. Hair must be completely tied back if it is longer than the collar with a plain school colour or uniform material scrunchy, ribbon or headband.
- Fashionable extremes, alternate hair colour and style are not acceptable on a temporary or permanent basis. This includes but not limited to mohawks, rat tails, tracks / decorative + patterned lines.
- Excessively short hair is not permitted – i.e. no cuts less than a Number 2 Grade.
- Parents are asked to regularly check their child/children's hair to prevent lice infestation. Students that present with lice will be isolated from other students and parents / caregivers will be called to collect their child for hair treatment. Students are required to stay away from school a day after treatment as per CES guidelines.
- Nail polish on fingernails is not permitted.

### Accessories

- A simple necklace with a religious or heritage symbol only – to be worn inside shirt/dress.
- The wearing of rings, bracelets, bangles and other jewellery is not permitted.
- A watch may be worn
- A Medic Alert bracelet/necklace is permitted and the school must be notified of the child/children's medical condition.
- A maximum of two plain gold/silver small sleeper or gold/silver stud ( maximum size 5mm) per ear lobe may be worn. A small coloured gemstone or birthstone in the stud is acceptable.

NB: The school will not accept responsibility for jewellery items or other personal belongings. Uniform Shop The school has a uniform shop. A uniform list is sent home to all school families.
